



State Of The Church

It was a year ago last May when we shared the news that "the posts were rotten and the rafters were rickety" in Fischer Hall. The Elders first heard the news at our Elder retreat as we were seeking God's leading and setting goals. How timely! So, what were we going to do? We did the two things that our church is known for; we started praying and we made a bookmark! Remember? Just in case you left your copy in your other Bible, here are the items we prayed for and a brief comment on each of them.

Unity- Pray that our church will remain united as we worshipin face the challenges of repairing and renovating Fischer Hall. "We proclaim Him,

We have enjoyed such a sweet spirit in our fellowship this past year, more than ever before. Challenges bring out the best in us and we all displayed a "Spirit of unity in the bond of peace." We prayed more than we have in the past, we experienced greater joy despite ongoing delays in the permit process.

Wisdom- God's wisdom and direction for the Elders, Site Development team, Finance team, Lisa Slater, our structural engineer, and H&A Construction as they

work together to make key decisions, coordinate with the County, and deal with the permit process.

Thank you Lisa! Thank you Don and the Site Development Team! Thank you, finance team! Thank all of those who have given such great counsel as we have navigated through the County permit process! Where some would get critical and complain, we let our light shine in such a way that they saw our good works and glorified God in heaven.

Flexibility- That our pastors, staff, ministry leaders, and the body will be able to adapt schedules, events, and the needs of the church family to continue the current work of ministry within the limitations of our facilities.

Do you realize that over this last year close to 50% of our congregation has been involved in at least one ministry at this church, that we have done as much if not more ministry in half the space? Thank you for the creative ways we did ministry "outside the four walls" of the church and made our witness for Christ known.

Creativity- To use our time, talent, and treasures effectively for His kingdom purposes. To discover new

opportunities to partner with God, to meet current and future needs, and do ministry more creatively.

There are so many examples of this but let me share just one. When Pastor Kevin heard the news that we would have to abandon Fischer Hall and start doing our worship service the following week he didn't panic but worked with one of the Elders while they borrowed sound equipment, strung cables, picked up lights, and in a matter of days transformed our fellowship hall into where we have been worshiping since then! There are countless stories of the

sacrifice and creativity of our members to do God's work.

Stewardship- Pray for the Finance Team as they seek God's unexpected provisions, determine what is appropriate for this undertaking, and to help all of us give sacrificially.

You prayed and you gave, generously and sacrificially. In the midst of a quickly put together Capital Campaign, you have not only contributed to the building but met and exceeded the current budget amount required to do ministry. Thank You Laurelwood family for your continued

generous and faithful stewardship of what God has entrusted to you.

Spiritual and Numerical Growth- That God would use this opportunity for us to trust Him more, grow deeper in our faith, and as a result, see many come to faith in Christ.

Baptisms, new ministry, and great teaching has marked this past year. A new children's ministry director, new ministry leaders for our Young Adult, Adult Christian Learning and Boomers Plus Ministries, new small groups started, and advances in our Men's and Women's ministries have lead to greater spiritual growth. We now have, in addition to a Men's Leadership class, a new Women's Mentoring class and NextGen Leadership class for youth and young adults.

While we have faced a significant challenge as we vacated Fischer Hall, God used it this past year to increase our faith and flexibility. I look forward to what God is going to do this next year in and through us.



IMPACT: Youth Ministry

- After our first year of having separate MS and HS programs meeting on different nights, we learned a lot about both ministries and we adjusted the schedule for MS to meet Sundays and HS to meet Wednesdays, which has had its challenges, especially after losing our gym, but we've been able to keep up our momentum.
- Luke Jech has taken on a lot of new challenges this year, including creating and teaching an 11 week series on the Holy Spirit to our HS students. He's also been instrumental in leading our youth worship teams as well as providing solid mentoring and leadership to our students. He was married to Julia Jones in May and will be graduating the Convergence Program through CBNW in December.
- Our SWAG Team (Students With a Goal) made up of HS students serving with our MS students, have been a great addition to our MS staff team. They have used their creative gifts to plan out several theme nights and serve consistently on worship team and in small groups and many of them are part of Pastor Mike's NextGen Leadership class too!
- Our MS students have continued to bring a new level of energy to youth group each week and continue to reach out to their friends to come to youth group and learn about Jesus! They've been very flexible, both with the switch to Sundays and not having the gym to play in!
- Last fall we had our first (and hopefully annual) Staff and Student Leaders Training Retreat, which saw almost all of our staff and student leaders come for a weekend of encouragement, training, and some team building! It was a great start to our year and we're very blessed to have so many adults of all ages and high school student leaders committed to serving the youth and families here at Laurelwood!







Men's Ministry

- Built up a strong core group of people and established genuine relationships within the group.
- Served together with Compassion International, All God's Children International, and various members of the church.
- Reached out to our community by connecting with the young adults at City Harvest Church and the seniors at the Bonaventure Senior Living Center.

The vision and goal for this year was to strive to engage and bring men together from all generations.

- Started the year in April with the Men's Advance • at Lifeway's "Main Event" at Crossroads locally. We had 20 men for the 2 day event listening to great speakers, worship great and fellowship
- The Wednesday morning and Thursday evening men's study continue to go strong. We also had a Sunday morning class for the first time.
- In June we had about 10 men doing a variety of

projects in conjunction with Victorious Sisterhood, helping with painting and small home repair jobs.

- In September, we had a full cabin of men and sons and grandsons attend Men's Roundup for great music, food, worship and an awesome message on endurance from the featured speaker Paul Tripp.

Treasurer's Report


We now have seen surpluses of giving over spending for the last 5 years. This continues to indicate our capacity for greater ministry. We continue to collect capital campaign funds and move onward toward restoring Fischer Hall and satisfying future facility needs in response to our growth. We are excited to see how God will use his funds to further his Kingdom. Through God's blessing, the attendees and members of Laurelwood gifted almost \$1.1 million toward the General Fund, Missions, Capital Campaign, Facility Improvements and Benevolent Fund. Overall, we have increased our cash accounts by almost \$270,000. I want to encourage each of us to pray for God's wisdom and guidance on our next steps for growth.





Sunday School


Many thanks to Jerry Matte for serving as our ACL coordinator. Great appreciation as well for all our ACL teachers. In addition to our ongoing studies of the Parables of Jesus as well as adding a Teach the Teachers Seminar, we continued a full course of classes in our Discovery Series; Discovery Class, Stewardship, Evangelism, Worship, SHAPE Class, Prayer, Fellowship, and Bible Study class. Our stated goal is to develop fully devoted followers of God through teaching and application of God's Word.

SHAPE: Members of the class have a better understanding of who God created them to be, what motivates them, where is their passion, how to use their abilities and experience as well as improved communication skills with others. Spring/Fall classes had 25 participants.

Love & Respect: During the course of the 5 classes these topics were discussed along with the DVD presentation: "The Five Love Languages by Dr. Gary Chapman", "20 Rules for a Great Marriage by Dr. Steve Stephens", Prepare & Enrich assessments and Marriage Team coaching are introduced (creators are Al & Autumn Ray) Oct/April classes had 25 participants.

Depression Class: Excellent 4 week Class presented by Pastor Mike Wilde. He identifies the many symptoms and factors involved in a person suffering from depression. He talks about the development of depression and how to deal with it. He talks about the steps involved in helping others as depression consumes them.

Outreach Ministry



Caring Team members touched every aspect of Body Life by ministering through the celebrations of:

- Multiple outreach events with 160 children who heard God's word during Vacation Bible School, 195 kids from the community attended the Harvest Carnival where the gospel was presented through puppet shows and face paintings with 6 kids coming to Christ that evening, and we had our first Ultimate Christmas Party where we celebrated Jesus' birth with 58 kids!
- Multigenerational discipleship is at work! We have 83 adults and youth serving on Sundays and in Club 66. More than 25 of them are parents with kids in the children's ministry. Parents are in the classrooms modeling what it means to be a disciple, and their kids are there to witness it!
- Children want to serve God! Every Sunday we have 10 or more kids serving in the Elementary Kidz Worship class as greeters, ushers, worship team, a/v tech, and more. Kids are eager to worship God by serving. We even have 13 recent graduates from the children's ministry serving in the children's ministry now!


rejoice! God is busy at work to make all of this beautiful chaos work together for His glory, for our good and for the furthering of the Gospel in the East Vancouver community.
