LOOKING BACK











It is often the case that when tough times come, it brings out the true character of people. What a blessing to see how the Laurelwood family has gone through this past year with great character and perseverance. Thank you, Laurelwood family, for your support, your service, and your sacrifice.

Two years ago, I led a series of meetings with various ministry leaders to help us better understand the role of parents as the primary disciple makers and the role of the church in supporting this. We felt so strongly that our Vision — "Disciples of Christ Making Disciples for Christ"

was changed to reflect this idea of inter-generational discipleship to "Following Jesus Together".

Pastor Luke has been intentionally raising up youth leaders who in turn direct our youth ministry. Allison DeViney, our Women's Ministry Director, is integrating our young girls into our women's ministry to make sure we are connecting with them and raising them as fully devoted followers of Christ. Our church saw the need to move a part time childrens director position to full time and the fantastic search team that

brought us Coach John - who is implementing this vision. Our Men's ministry studied the role of mentoring to seek to be intentional in this important role of discipleship.

Our giving remains good and, for the tenth year in a row, we have another surplus at fiscal year's end. This is in addition to seeing a record number of boxes sent through Operation Christmas Child; 742 boxes in 2019 and that includes the cost for all the shipping, almost \$7,000! We served 27 families with a total of 52 children in 2019 in our Angel Tree Ministry. Each child received two gifts for a total of 104 gifts and 52 age appropriate Bibles. In our SafePark

Ministry, we hosted 29 guests this past year and 16 found housing. Since we started, we have had 104 guests with 32 who found housing. The Laurelwood family has been very generous in their giving to the Benevolent fund and we have helped so many, especially in this time of pandemic crisis in our nation.

Speaking of the Covid-19 virus, we had to move our worship services online and, as I write this, we have had 16 services where we have had to host it from our "studio" to your homes. Yet, our ability to do ministry has increased; not only how you have been meeting the needs of the

members with your gifts, calls, and visits, but you are being the church in your neighborhoods!

We have gained a net of 9 members over the year, actually 24 new members, but 15 have moved away or stopped attending. We even have three people who want to join the church during this pandemic!

One area of concern is that we had no baptisms in this past fiscal year. Our last baptism

was at the end of April of 2019. It will be important, as we move ahead, to continue to be diligent with our seven for heaven, not only praying for them but caring for them and nudging them one step closer to Jesus. It will be important for us, as a church, to create easy "on ramps" for people to come and see, and to create environments in our homes and lives for those that don't know Christ to come and see Him for themselves.

Thank You, Laurelwood family, for your faithfulness, your service, and your love for God and others. It is both an honor and blessing to be your pastor.



This year, we were forced to discover a new way of doing worship and church gatherings: Live Stream services! In less than a week, we converted the Green Room into a Studio and have been improving our Live Stream services each week. We have added new gear for Live Streams (lights, cameras, interface equipment) and we have included creative elements that have been received well (congregation videos, ministry updates, interactive prayer time, etc.)





We celebrated Christmas with the theme of "First Christmas" and used a series of short videos that were first person narratives of what the first Christmas was like. It was a wonderful outreach event and an encouraging time for all. Along with the LBC Kids choir, we had over 50 people participating in this very special Christmas celebration and over 250 attend.

Before the pandemic hit, the Worship Ministry made a huge shift to be more "peer-led" with a planning time each week by the worship team. This was a time where we looked at the scripture and the message and planned songs as a team

around that theme. Also, more people took a leadership role and Kevin played more backup. I look forward to when we gather again and move back to this format.



Men

Our first event kicking off the year was our "Men's Ascent," a Friday evening/Saturday gathering of 35 men at Laurelwood on June 7-8. We started Friday evening with a BBQ, worship singing, and the first of 4 weekend sessions led by Dr. John Vawter. He spoke on the subject matter of the book he co-authored: "Achieving High Performance Friendship." Following lunch on Saturday, a number of the men participated in fellowship outings which included golf, hiking, and gun range shooting.





Eleven LBC men filled a cabin at Camp Tadmor with approximately 1,200 other men for the CBNW annual Men's Round-Up the weekend of September 6-8. Our main speaker was Rick McKinley, lead pastor of Imago Dei Church in Portland. Rick addressed the question: "What does it mean to be men who follow Jesus faithfully in a world that is increasingly hostile to our faith?" Worship, breakout sessions, fabulous food, and numerous outdoor activities made for an action packed weekend.

Fifteen men participated in our Men's Study lead by Doug Lundahl on Wednesday mornings and Syd Jones on Thursday evenings on the topic "mentoring and making disciples." In each session we interacted over videos covering numerous discipleship topics.

An average of 25 men joined for a men's

breakfast at LBC approximately every 6 weeks throughout the year until the pandemic lockdown. Each time various speakers within our church body gave a devotional talk.

Every year camps are always an amazing time to watch God intensely work through our students' lives. This year we had a few firsts including our middle school summer camp moving to Camp Arrah Wanna, combining with Journey and Evergreen Bible for our High School Winter Retreat, and Luke speaking for the first time at ETM. God was so faithful to us at camps this year!



Laurelwood Youth's Ministry had to make a quick pivot to meeting online. We are so thankful for the means that the Lord has provided us as we got to continue to connect with students on YouTube and Zoom. Our planning team got creative and kept our students engaged through livestreams, video lessons, dance parties, and even a gospel illusionist. Our planning team put together a home visit day where we visited 29 homes of students, while social distancing. Thank the Lord that we have been able to minister to our students even without a building to meet at!

The splitting of the K-5 Worship hour to K-3 and the launch of the BIG D.O.G.S. (Big Disciples of God), i.e., the 4^{th} and 5^{th} graders. We can do more age appropriate lessons with each age group now.

The older kids are excited to have their own group, and the younger children already can't wait to become a Big Dog (which should help with retention). The first Big Dog field trip was a huge success, with a devotion held right in the Christian

bookstore at the Mall. It is a shame the virus stopped our momentum, but we did get together for 9-10 weeks with group Zoom calls.

Leng Halstead and her team did an incredible job with Thursday Club 66 meetings. Any where from 40-60 kids came each night to learn about Jesus. And the virus did not stop them as they turned to Zoom meetings to end the year.

Just like the overall church has learned to do ministry in a new way with livestream, so has the children's department by going 'old school'. When the Stay at Home period started, we started doing weekly mailings to over 60 kids...every week. We have sent puzzles, stickers, Bible activity books, craft projects, etc. along with a note to the kids. Reports are the kids feel they are an important part of the church. Reports also include that some kids run to the mail box each day to see if they have received something from the church! Most importantly, Laurelwood is still ministering to it's children during the virus crisis.

The Small Group ministry really grew this year as more people than ever got connected to a Small Group. We now have 233 people who are currently involved in a Small Group.

During the Fall Small Group Kickoff, we had 66 people sign up who had never been in a group before. This is the most signups we have ever had during a two week kickoff. Additionally, 3 new groups formed.

In total, there are now 15 unique small groups with incredible leaders that are ministering to people in our church on a regular basis

As a church, we provided significant support for 9 missionaries and organizations in fruitful service locally and around the world. With our regular missions budget, along with the special vote on use of surplus giving, we were also able to make significant contributions to missionary projects, including building projects for the Valenzuelas, Bozons and Freedom House, as well as helping the Vargheses to assist Christian day laborers affected by COVID in India.

In November, we packed 742 shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child - the most ever!

In December, we provided gifts for 52 children from 27 families as part of the Angel Tree ministry.

Our Safepark ministry has now served over 100 families since we began participating in 2017, with 32 families transitioning to permanent housing!




TREASURER'S REPORT

Despite not being able to meet physically since March, giving has remained consistent. Generous giving has allowed us to provide additional support to our missionary partners while continuing to aggressively pay down our mortgage despite the COVID-19 pandemic. 
